We would like to welcome you all and wish you Happy New Year. We hope you all had a happy and healthy Christmas, and we look forward to hearing all your children's exciting news about seeing family, Santa, and any gifts they may have received.

For the month of January, we will be enjoying a Winter and Polar theme. Our core story is Say Hello to the Snowy Animals. We will be exploring polar lands with sensory play with artificial snow, shaving foam and ice. We will learn about polar animals and create wintery artwork with cool colours. The children will explore the weather as it changes throughout the month, experiencing frosty, icy, misty, or snowy days but hopefully not too many more rainy days! In February we will go on to explore Places and Spaces and our core story will be Going on a Bear Hunt.
